About the workshop

The aim of the course is to provide an introduction to Australian oil and gas law, which will be accessible not only to lawyers entering the field but also to those already concerned with oil and gas issues – government officials, resource company personnel and others – who seek an understanding of the legal context in which they arise. Plenary sessions in the form of lectures interspersed with class discussion are supplemented by small-group sessions examining in greater detail concrete or topical problems in the framing or application of the law.

Guest speakers include Professor **Terence Daintith**, a leading international expert on oil and gas law, members of AMPLA and of AIPN's Australia/Asia chapter and leading specialists in oil and gas law drawn from private practice, government, and in-house counsel.
